Dr. Daniel J. Wilson, PhD is Professor Emeritus of History at Muhlenberg College, Allentown, PA.

He had polio in 1955 and began developing symptoms of Post-Polio Syndrome in 1987. He is the author of several books on the history of Polio including: “Living with Polio: The Epidemic and Its Survivors” (2005) and “Polio: Biography of a Disease” (2009).
