

Exploring Timeliness of Cancer Diagnosis in Persons with Physical Disability

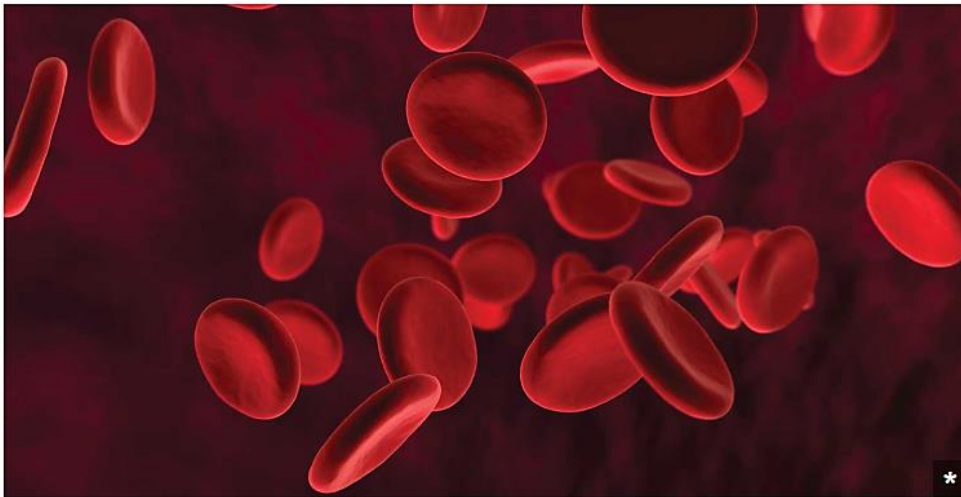
My name is Nicole Agaronnik and I am a research assistant working with Dr. Lisa Iezzoni at the Mongan Institute Health Policy Research Center at Massachusetts General Hospital.

We are currently recruiting volunteers for a research study funded by the National Institute of Health about delays in diagnosing cancer among people with disability. We are looking at people with mobility disability, who later develop cancer (with the exception of melanoma).

We are hoping to interview 20 people by telephone who fit these criteria about their experiences.
